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### A message from the Mayor

I must begin by thanking my fellow Councillors for electing me Chairman and Mayor for the forthcoming year.

To lead the Council is a great honour that I never anticipated happening in such a short space of time. Chairing the Princes Centre, Market Group and Business Group I hope has set me in good stead for the role.

I have the privilege of having three former Mayors on the Council to provide advice and guidance with Eunice Clifford and Ben Benifer also local. My thanks must go to Alan Turner whom has served in the role for seven years and I wish him great success in his new roles at the District Council.

As a Town Council we are undertaking some of the largest investments in our history. The Market House renovations will begin later in the year in excess of £150,000 to safeguard this wonderful local monument. The first two hundred LED street lights will be installed reducing our environmental footprint and the Crescent play area will be receiving new equipment too.

All of these improvements are being delivered with no increase in the Precept for the 7th year running. Credit must go to our Clerk Susanne Griffiths for keeping a tight lid on expenditure and finding new ways of generating income. The administration of the Council equates to less than two full time equivalent posts, which based on our size is practically unheard of at this level of local Government.

You may remember from previous issues I have always taken a keen interest in the development of our Devolved Services scheme. I understand there has recently been some criticism about the standard of work and I would like to apologise for this and to assure you that our Maintenance team work extraordinarily hard for the benefit of the town and will continue to do so. Our income from the County Council towards grass cutting does not exceed £5000 per annum, which equates to just three cuts a year.

With a further six cuts required we have to find the money for these (in excess of £10,000) out of our own limited funds and whilst the weather has been against us, we are working together to improve the situation, please bear with us and I hope you will notice an improvement soon.

Our annual Town Festival is nearly upon us and I hope you are all looking forward to celebrating the Best of Britain and Princes Risborough. With a record number of stalls, a new food court and many of our local organisations and clubs participating, this is going to be a fantastic week. Watch out for the official Festival programme that is due to land on your doorstep anytime now. I look forward to seeing you there!

### **TOWN MATTERS**

Since my last report a number of issues have become clearer and the Town Council is now in a position to go ahead with a number of projects.

One such project is the much requested continuation

of the path across the King George V Playing Field and it is hoped that work will commence in late August. This path will make it much easier for both disabled persons and those with pushchairs or buggies to access and enjoy the park.



regard In to the upgrading of the play equipment in the Crescent Park, we will soon be in a position to carry out a consultation with both exercise nearby residents and also the children who will use the park as to the type of play equipment they would like to see

installed. This is a two-year project, with half the money coming from this year's budget and the same amount next year.

In **Wades Park** it has been noted that since the installation of the fencing around the Maintenance Area there has been a depletion of luminance along the path that passes in front of the site. We are in the process of obtaining quotes for the installation of an electrical connection to the site so that we can provide lighting along the fence to do away with any dark areas.

The **Earle Mitchell** changing room has at long last been renovated and now users will be able to change in a more conducive atmosphere.

The Town Council has been granted authority to apply for a loan from the Public Works Loan Board for the remainder of the monies needed to complete the restoration of the **Market House** and so once this is in place we should see work commencing to enhance and repair this listed building. The work should render the building more available for public use as a small meeting room and for displays and exhibitions. The **Lighting Project Team** are finalising plans to upgrade our lighting stock to a much more energy efficient form of lighting and looking at additional energy suppliers to further keep costs down. We





hope to have further news by the next edition of Crosstalk.

The flower beds around the town have been planted. This will mean that our Maintenance Team will be kept very busy keeping the beds in good shape and giving them a regular watering. As stated before the colour scheme this year is red, white and blue to acknowledge the 90th birthday of her Majesty the Oueen and this falls in line also with the theme of this year's festival.

We look forward to welcoming back the judges from **Britain in Bloom** to Risborough, on

July 12th. We hope to build upon last year's success and would like to thank the following for helping us with this years entry; Monks Risborough Horticultural Society, Monks Risborough Primary School, Whiteleaf Scouts & Cubs and the Askett Society. Wish us luck and we look forward to sharing some good news in the next issue.

Some concern has been expressed with the condition of the grass verges around the town where vehicles are regularly parked thereon or driven across. These concerns have been passed on to the relevant authorities at BCC and WDC.

### **Parking Review Update**

Further to my Crosstalk article last March I am pleased to inform you that Alan Turner and I met with Bucks County Council (BCC) councillors on the 25th of May to go through the amended maps that outline the proposed no waiting and permit restrictions for our town.

As I reported in my last update, the results of the public consultations have been addressed and in our opinion the proposed changes to the original blanket issuing of parking permits has been changed to reflect a more palatable option for our residents.

Now begins the legal process which is required for any waiting restriction traffic regulation order (TRO). The final drawings are legal drawings called Tiles, these will all need to be agreed by all members that sit on the BCC parking review which includes Alan Turner and myself during our next meeting on the 30th of June 2016. Once these maps have been agreed there will be local advertisements and a letter delivered to

1300 homes, followed by a formal online 21 day consultation for residents that live within the affected area. Copies of the final draft and agreed maps will be available online, in the library and the Town Council office. Once all the legalities and online consultation have taken place and there are no issues, it is anticipated that this parking review will be implemented towards the end of 2016.
