THE TOWN COUNCIL PRAYER

6. A REPORT FROM BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNCILLORS ON MATTERS CONCERNING PRINCES RISBOROUGH

Cllr B Bendyshe-Brown sent the following report: -

The High Street has been resurfaced. Duke Street and Market Square is still to be done and The Capital Maintenance Team (CMT) has apologised and said that their engineers believed that Duke Street did not require a complete resurface. I agree as there has been extensive drainage works and Thames Water also came in later and both made substantial resurfacing. Jasmine Crescent has also had an extensive resurfacing replacing all the badly worn areas

The forward programme for resurfacing was agreed with CMT last year for next Financial Year with Buckinghamshire Council Councillor Gary Hall is as follows: Whole length carriageway on Fairway and micro surfacing (joint seal) on Wellington Avenue to Dunsmore Avenue.

It has been stressed to CMT that the footways in the Fields estate requires full repairs and in particular Highfield Road and the urgency of completing Picts Lane.

Work continues with Blanchfords to try and stop the lorries parking outside their entrance. To reinforce this the Enforcement Team have been asked to attend Picts Lane.

The owners of The Paddocks are based in Luxembourg and they have been contacted asking for advice on the future of the building. A response is awaited.

The Mobile Vehicle Activation Sign is on loan to the Whiteleaf Residents Association to use on Peters Lane to warn drivers of the 30mph speed limit. Several firms have been contacted regarding the whitelining on Peters Lane and Whiteleaf.
