

Risborough Youth Club has existed since 1974 and has operated almost continuously. That was until March last year when the first national lockdown occurred. In September 2020, as the schools reopened and based on government advice for the youth sector, the club reopened. Although the doors closed again earlier this year, the Youth Club has been open every week since April.

With the numbers of young people gradually increasing each week and a stream of new faces, the club is well on their way to returning to "full swing".

Risborough Youth Club meets every Monday night, including during school holidays, from 19:00 to 20:30. It is open to everyone aged 11 to 17. More information is available at **www.risboroughyouth.club** or search for **Risborough Youth Club** on social media.



News from St Mary's Church

St Mary's Church has spent the 20 months since the start of Lockdown 1.0 focusing on helping vulnerable members of our community.

First came Princes Risborough Food Cupboard, a local food bank set up with the other churches, to provide food and other essentials to those in need, including those impacted by pandemic restrictions on people's ability to work. At the peak volunteers were delivering to over 35 households (about 120 people) each week, although in recent weeks the number of customers has reduced as people are finding ways to support themselves.

Since July 2021 the Food Cupboard has been closely aligned with OneCan Trust in High Wycombe.

OneCan has many years' experience, and a network of support organisations which customers can be referred to for debt counselling and other assistance.

In September this year, attention turned to a new Monthly Lunch Club aimed at helping the older, lonely, vulnerable or isolated members of the community. The Lunch Club takes place on the 1st Wednesday of the month.

Councillor Wins National award



We're really excited to let you know that our previous Chairman and Town Mayor, Cllr Matthew Walsh, was recently named a winner in the National Association of Local Council's (NALC) Star Council Awards 2021.

NALC's Star Council Awards are the only awards in England to recognise and celebrate the contribution the local (parish and town) council sector makes to its communities.

The theme of this year's awards focused on projects that have positively impacted communities in the context of COVID-19.

Cllr Walsh says:

"I am truly humbled to have won the Councillor of the Year Award. This award does not belong just to me but to everybody that played a part in the success of the Council over the past year, and the challenges brought on by the pandemic. Without the stellar efforts of our council officers and members, we could have not achieved what we did. Risborough is a wonderful community and I am very proud of my small part in it". Cllr Walsh is now a Bucks County Councillor and continues to work hard for the residents of Risborough. Congratulations Matt, a brilliant achievement.

Slow Down!

Speeding has reached epidemic proportions and calls for a paradigm shift in the way we tackle it. That shift must include a change in the perception and management of community volunteers' involvement with road safety.

For many understandable reasons, enforcement and

broad-stroke campaigning have

made little progress over the

past decade, and focused, largescaled education is currently only organised efficiently in the shape of Speed Awareness Courses after an offence is detected. Modern preventative educational methodologies like Speedwatch have yet to be utilised to its fullest extent. Now is a good time to change that. Research show that on average 97% of speeding offences (not including Speedwatch observations) are detected by speed cameras. The vast majority of these are fixed at the roadside in areas known to both local residents and regular commuters, hence - and in spite of the so-called 'Halo-effect', they have little effect in areas not covered by camera technology. Equally relevant - and especially to rural areas where fatalities are four times more likely to happen than in urban areas, the discussion about road safety has a tendency to focus on number of collision casualties alone. In most areas where Speedwatch operates and where speeding evidently is a concern to the communities, the quality-of-life issue as well as feeling safe when using the roads recreationally,

are equally important to the



affected areas' residents. This is not an attempt at diminishing the dismay of the high number of fatal and seriously injured victims but a reminder that the problem of speeding goes well beyond quantifying its consequences with casualty statistics alone. Inconsistently applied enforcement methodology is not likely to change socially perceived acceptable behaviour if the majority of those caught speeding either are not - or consider themselves habitual speeders. Increased compliance with the law can be achieved with other means than enforcement. In the case of Speedwatch, personalised education is a methodology that is just as efficient to help bring the problem under control.

Organising concerned, proactive

community volunteers on a grand scale is vital to succeed with this goal.

PRTC were asked by TVP to consider organising a Community Speedwatch team and the Council were pleased to oblige.

The new Speedwatch Group has now been established and the initial team put together, however we are now looking for non Council members to join the team.
