## 2023/2024 Council Tax

Setting the council tax is a very important part of the Town Council's duty and responsibilities which affects us all.

In agreeing on the council tax for the coming financial year members of the Town Council have been mindful of the overall state of matters relating to the whole of the country and especially those relating to residents of Princes Risborough and have limited the rise to 5%.

There are some major projects which as a council we must address.

Due to the success of the Princes Centre, it has become necessary for the Town Council office to relocate. Having investigated numerous options the members have decided, after public consultation, that moving to the Wades Centre is the most appropriate and cost-effective solution. Another essential project is the development of


phase 2 of the Stratton Memorial Garden. This is still being formulated but the council intend to

## Phase 2 Wades Centre refurbishment update

Back in November, we held a consultation relating to the development of Phase 2 of the Wades Centre. A huge thank you to all those who joined us at the dropin sessions and responded to the consultation, the results of which are shown below.

The results show an overwhelming yes to the planned refurbishment which allows the Town Council to apply for the necessary funds from the Public Works Loan Board.

The Town Council is hoping that the work could start as early as June 2023, following which we hope to be able to install the solar panels by the end of 2023. Further details regarding this project and Phase 3 can be found on our website.

## **Community Speedwatch update**



The Princes Risborough Community Speedwatch campaign is in good health. We have 13 members who between them have run 35 sessions. The designated sites are located on all the major roads in and out of Princes Risborough and the groups are performing up to 5 sessions per week. In general, results are showing that 10% of drivers are speeding across all these sites.

## Have you heard of the North West Chilterns **Community Board (NWC CB)?**

If you haven't, the NWC CB is a Board which focus on work around tailors itself to the needs of the local area with the common goal of bringing communities together to make a difference. The Board uses local data and intelligence, and, together with engagement and listening to the people in the community, it prioritises areas of focus and explores the issues that are of the greatest importance in the local area.

These priorities help determine where the NWC CB can engage, take action, and in some cases, allocate funding to improve the local area. The Community Board holds a mixture of core and taskfocused actions group meetings which explore local and corporate priorities, set up projects and finds creative ways to meet local challenges. Our current actions focus on economic recovery and improving the environment. community resilience and transport and road issues.

The Community Board have funded a number of successful projects, an example is below but there are so many more. The Board collaborated with a local organisation to develop a project which engaged with young people from a range of schools/ community organisations, to provide a number of conservation activities to enhance habitats and educate individuals. The Board also linked a local charity and Buckinghamshire


Council's Helping Hands team to provide hot meal vouchers to individuals and families.




